Teachers must at least:

- Hold a valid professional license or certificate.
- Have taught a minimum of 7 years. (substituting does not count toward years).
- Work a minimum of 120 days during the current school year.
- Work under a teaching contract / employed as teacher.
- National Board Certified teachers qualify upon application.

NORWAYNE MASTER TEACHER TIMELINE

September - All master teacher candidates must submit their completed application to their building LPDC representative for the September LPDC meeting. For the 2009-10 school year, applications will be accepted at the January meeting.
